








A GROWING HOUSING CRISIS IN THE METHOW VALLEY



The Methow Valley has an estimated 350-unit (rental and ownership) housing shortage. **The Methow Housing Trust** is committed to addressing a portion of that need by building and stewarding 70 permanently affordable homes by 2030.

Thanks to our community, by this summer MHT will have built and sold 21 permanently affordable homes to full time Methow Valley residents since 2017.

Today, the Methow Housing Trust develops affordable homeownership opportunities for local residents, and... it's clear that solving the housing crisis will require a multi-solution, "all hands on deck" approach to create additional solutions: affordable homeownership, market rate rentals, subsidized and seasonal rentals, senior housing, and more.

The Methow Housing Trust will be at the table with other community partners, helping the community advance housing solutions to ensure a future Methow Valley that is vibrant, diverse, and equitable.




Meet Harper Lee, our first baby born in a MHT neighborhood! Congrats to her parents Brandon and Kate!
